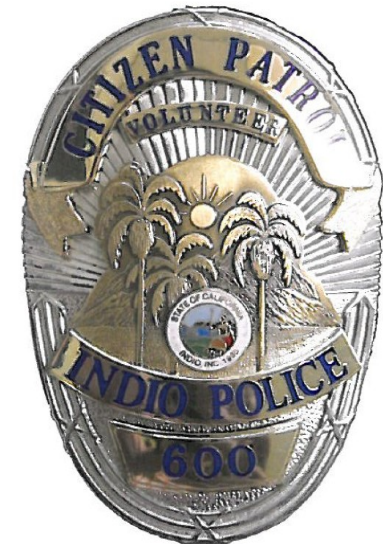

Responsibilities will range from patrolling businesses and government buildings, assisting with parking enforcement, Code Enforcement, police station assignments and special events.



VOLUNTEER

Volunteers will receive:

1. Classroom training during the Citizen Patrol Academy.
2. Field Training.
3. Uniforms.
4. Equipment necessary to perform assigned duties.

As a Volunteer You Must Possess the Ability to:

1. Work well with others.
2. Follow IPD policy and procedures.
3. Attend monthly Citizens Patrol meetings.
4. Aid in the achievement of the goals and objectives of the Indio Police Department and the City of Indio.

Qualifications:

1. Age 21, or older.
2. No felony convictions.
3. Valid Drivers License.
4. Ability to Qualify for Motor Vehicle insurance.

5. Complete Volunteer Application.
6. Pass an Oral Review.
7. Pass a Background Investigation.
8. Pass a Physical Exam.
9. Complete Academy and Field Training.
10. Must Have Access to Email.
